BUNK HOUSE ROOMS NAMING OPPORTUNITIES

You are invited to support the Cascade Pacific Council, Boy Scouts of America partnership with Outdoor Schools to offer outdoor learning opportunities to the young people of our communities.

As a 780-acre ocean front property with two miles of shoreline, a lake, beautiful streams and wonderful forest, Camp Meriwether is a highly desirable and unmatched location for Outdoor School.

While Outdoor School is a primary reason for the bunkhouses, the buildings will be used year-round for a variety of purposes.

By providing students, teachers and parents opportunities to experience Outdoor School at Camp Meriwether, we can deepen relationships with school officials and broaden Scouting access across our communities.



How Does The Naming Opportunity Work?

For a gift of **\$10,000** we are offering naming opportunities for each of the 22 bunk house rooms.

Donor recognition will be created for each of the 22 rooms with a plaque, as well as a donor recognition plaque in a central location.

ESTABLISHING PARTNERSHIPS

As we seek to impart values, including a life-long interest in nature, a continued Outdoor School partnership is consistent with our overall mission.

In recent years, Camp Meriwether was used for roughly 44 of the days in a 365-day year, which includes 50 weekends per year. Since the camp was seldomly used Monday through Friday during the school year, Outdoor School is a perfect fit.

The moderate climate on the coast (compared to many other Outdoor School sites) would provide a longer more adaptable schedule for schools to choose from, which would lengthen the Outdoor School season.

Due to our partnership with OMSI and Tillamaook

Schools in 2019, utilization increased to more than 60%. Once the bunkhouses and cabins are built, we believe annual utilization will exceed 80% based upon the temperate climate and remarkable beauty of our property on the coast.

By providing students, teachers and parents opportunities to experience Outdoor School at Camp Meriwether, we can deepen relationships with school officials and broaden Scouting access across our communities.

Children and Nature

The best education does not happen at a desk but rather engaged in everyday living - hands on, exploring, in an active relationship with nature. Exposure to nature can reduce stress in children by 28%.
