

# SECOND CLASS HIKING SCOUT CHALLENGE

IF YOU ARE A SCOUT, HERE'S AN OPPORTUNITY TO WORK  
ON A FEW ADVANCEMENT REQUIREMENTS!

- Explain the principles of Leave no Trace and tell how you practiced them on a hike. (see 2nd class 1b)
- Demonstrate how a compass works and how to orient a map. Use a map to point out and tell the meaning of 5 map symbols (see 2nd class 3a)
- Using a compass and map together, take a 5-mile hike approved by your adult leader and your parent or guardian. (see 2nd class 3b)
- Describe some hazards or injuries that you might encounter on a hike and what you can do to help prevent them. (see 2nd class 3c)
- Demonstrate how to find directions during the day and at night without using a compass or an electronic device. (see 2nd class 3d)
- Identify or show evidence of at least 10 kinds of wild animals. (see 2nd class 4)
- Show first aid for puncture wounds from a splinter, nail, and fishhook. Tell what you can do while on a hike to prevent them. (see 2nd class 6a &c)
- Show first aid for dehydration and heat exhaustion. Tell what you can do while on a hike to prevent them. (see 2nd class 6a &c)
- Explain what to do in cases of accidents that require emergency response in the home and backcountry. Explain what constitutes an emergency and what information you will need to provide to a responder. (see 2nd class 6d)
- Participate in a service hike that involves trail clean-up or trash sweep. (see 2nd class 8e)
