## *Elements of the training include:*

Rank requirement skills from Tenderfoot thru 1<sup>st</sup> Class including: Campsite & Firesite Selection, Outdoor Ethics Plant ID, Animal ID, Packing & Hiking, Map & Compass, Ropes & Knots, Woods Tools, Cooking

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (IOLS) will be held in conjunction with the Cascade Pacific Council ScoutsBSA Super Weekend. If you are attending with a Super Weekend unit, you should sleep and eat with that unit.

If you are attending without a host troop, a campsite will be provided for you. Saturday lunch, which you will prepare, will be provided as part of the IOLS course.

All other meals will either be eaten with your host unit or, if you are not attending with a unit, with the Super Weekend and IOLS staffs in the Camp Meriwether dining hall.

All participants are expected to camp in a tent overnight Saturday evening as part of the course. Classes will start Saturday morning at 9:00AM and end Sunday at Noon.
