"Scouting Through the Seasons"

General Information:

Who: Webelos Dens/Crews/Scouts BSA Patrols

What: Patrol competition, and fun events

When and Where: February 26, 2022

Ray Benson Snow Park is located on the top of Santiam Pass past where Highway 22 and Highway 20 join.

At the top of the Pass, turn right onto the access road (sign says

Hoodoo Ski Area, Big Lake Road, & Benson Snow-Park). Travel one mile to the fork in the road and stay left on Forest Service Road 2690. Continue to the plowed parking lot.

We will be on the near side of the lot at the far end.

Cell phone coverage exists at the Klondike Derby site.

What to Bring: See Personal List and Patrol list in this document.

Lunch: Each registered participant will bring a can of non-cream soup. Bowls, spoons, hot coco and fruit will be provided. Soup cans will be turned in at the first station - Sled Inspection.

Registration: Cubmaster/Senior Patrol/Crew Leader will turn in a written list of who is in each patrol/crew and all other youth and adults attending.

Registration is open Webelos Dens/Scout Patrols/Venture Crews with a Limit of 8 members for each Den/Patrol/Venture Crew.

Snow-Park Permits are required! A one-day permit costs \$4.00 for a one day, \$9.00 for a three day or \$25.00 for an annual permit. It is a \$30 ticket if you don't have one. Annual passes are available online, the rest are available from REI, there is a list of alternate locations online as well.

Camping: Camping is encouraged by all participants.

Facilities and Water

Pit toilets and a warming hut are available on the other side of the parking lot facilities are on site. Each Troop must bring their own drinking water for the Klondike Derby. There is no water at the Klondike Derby site.

Be prepared for winter weather including snow, cold temperatures, wind and bright sunshine.

Practice "Leave no Trace" principles at the Klondike Derby.

Derby Sleds

Klondike Derby sleds are customary for each Den/Patrol/Crew but are not required.

However, each Den/Patrol/Crew must have a method to transport your Klondike Derby supplies from one station to the next station.

Registration Information

Need registration site info

Registration fees are on the registration form \$12 per person.

Even if your Scout Troop or Venture Crew is not ready to register, please, let the Klondike Derby Chair know that you will be attending so we can plan on logistics. Adults and older scouts will need to assist individual Klondike Derby Stations, and you may sign up to staff a particular station with the Klondike Derby Chair.

Competition and Scoring

A Scorecard will be issued to each Den/Patrol/Crew at the registration tent.

The top three of all the Dens/Patrols/Crews will be recognized for their accomplishments.

The top three Dens/Patrols/Crews will be recognized for competing in the Iditarod Sled Race.

Each event winner will also receive a ribbon.

Scorecards will be returned to each Den/Patrol/Crew Leader if they wish.

Important Info for the 2022 Klondike Derby

At sled inspection station, each Den, Patrol, or Crew Member will be inspected to make sure they are properly dressed with appropriate winter clothing for the Klondike Derby. We will also check for ten essentials. Patrols will be scored based on how well they are dressed and prepared for the Klondike Derby.

Patrols should look over the events and bring appropriate equipment. I.E Rope, poles, tarp etc.

No Scouts over the age of 18 may compete in the Klondike Derby stations. Adults may follow along but are encouraged to let the Scouts and Patrol Leaders use their skills. Adults should only get involved in the event of a serious safety situation where your assistance is needed.

Competition Events

General Information

There are a total of 10 stations for the Klondike Derby.

Each station has a maximum of 100 points which can be earned.

Participants will be graded 10 points on teamwork, and 10 points on Scout Spirit and 80 on the task they are faced with at each station. Dens/Patrols/Crews are encouraged to bring their flag and give their yell at each station.

Units which arrive late will only be able to compete in the stations based on the schedule time allowed. No make-up sessions for late arrivals will be available.

Event Detail

NOTE: Adults, there is still time to join the fun! Contact Mr. Bendorf if you'd like to help with an event.

- Stretcher Build and Carry
A skill challenge to test Scouts' proficiency, remember, gear on your sled could help you win the derby
- Fire Making in the Snow
A classic Scout Skill challenge with a twist, how does snow change your fire making plan
- Sled Slalom / minefield
Agility, speed and accuracy are tested as your Scouts navigate the mine field!
- First Aid
What horrors await your Scouts in the frozen wild? Are they prepared to render First Aid?
- Ice Rescue
Oh no! A member of your Crew has fallen through the ice, can you save them, or will they be lost forever?
- Battleship
- Orienteering
Lost! How will you find your way to home and to warmth
- Snowman Building
Have you brought the proper gear to deck out your new Patrol mate?
- Kim's game
Attention to detail is the key for any Scout, what can you remember and report?
- Telephone
Rescue is at hand! But can you get the message to someone for help?
